#### music to play


Bible people played thank-you songs. They hit <u>cymbals</u> together They played the strings on <u>harps</u>. They blew into long <u>trumpets</u>.


#### singers

These <u>singers</u> sang praises to God at the <u>feast of thanksgiving</u>.










