

were praying. Paul and Silas told them about Jesus. One of the women, named Lydia, believed in Jesus as her Savior.




Later in the streets, they met a slave girl who had an evil spirit. Her owner made money from her. She told people their future. She kept




What I learned in God's Word this week: We can tell about Jesus wherever we are.


Shoring Mours Jesus

Make this bookmark to share with others the good news about Jesus. You can make one bookmark to keep in your Bible and one to give away to a friend you tell about Jesus. You can also make the bookmark into a bracelet or necklace.

#### You Need:

- String
- Beads—one each of yellow, green, red, a light color, and a dark color
- 1. Tie a knot at one end of the string.
- 2. Put one of each bead on the string.
- 3. Tie a knot at the other end of the string.
- Learn what each bead means and practice using your bookmark to tell about the good news about Jesus.
- 5. Share with a friend the good news about Jesus using your bookmark.





The red bead reminds us of Jesus' blood. Jesus died on the cross for our sin. (John 3:16)

The light colored bead reminds us Jesus died so we could have a clean heart and we could know God. (John 1:12-13) The yellow bead reminds us of heaven. Jesus is in heaven preparing a place for those who know Him. (John 14:2-3)

The green bead reminds us that everyone needs to grow in knowing Jesus. We grow by reading our Bible, praying, and going to church. (2 Peter 3:18)
