Family Time After you read the Bible story, tell it again. Pause after reading about each character who saw the hurt man and ask, "Does Jesus want us to be like that person?" Your child will imitate your actions as you shake your head and say no or nod and say yes. Let your child practice putting plastic bandages on a doll to show how the Samaritan helped the hurt man. Then help your child think of ways to be a good Samaritan and show kindness to each other at home. Say the memory verse together.
