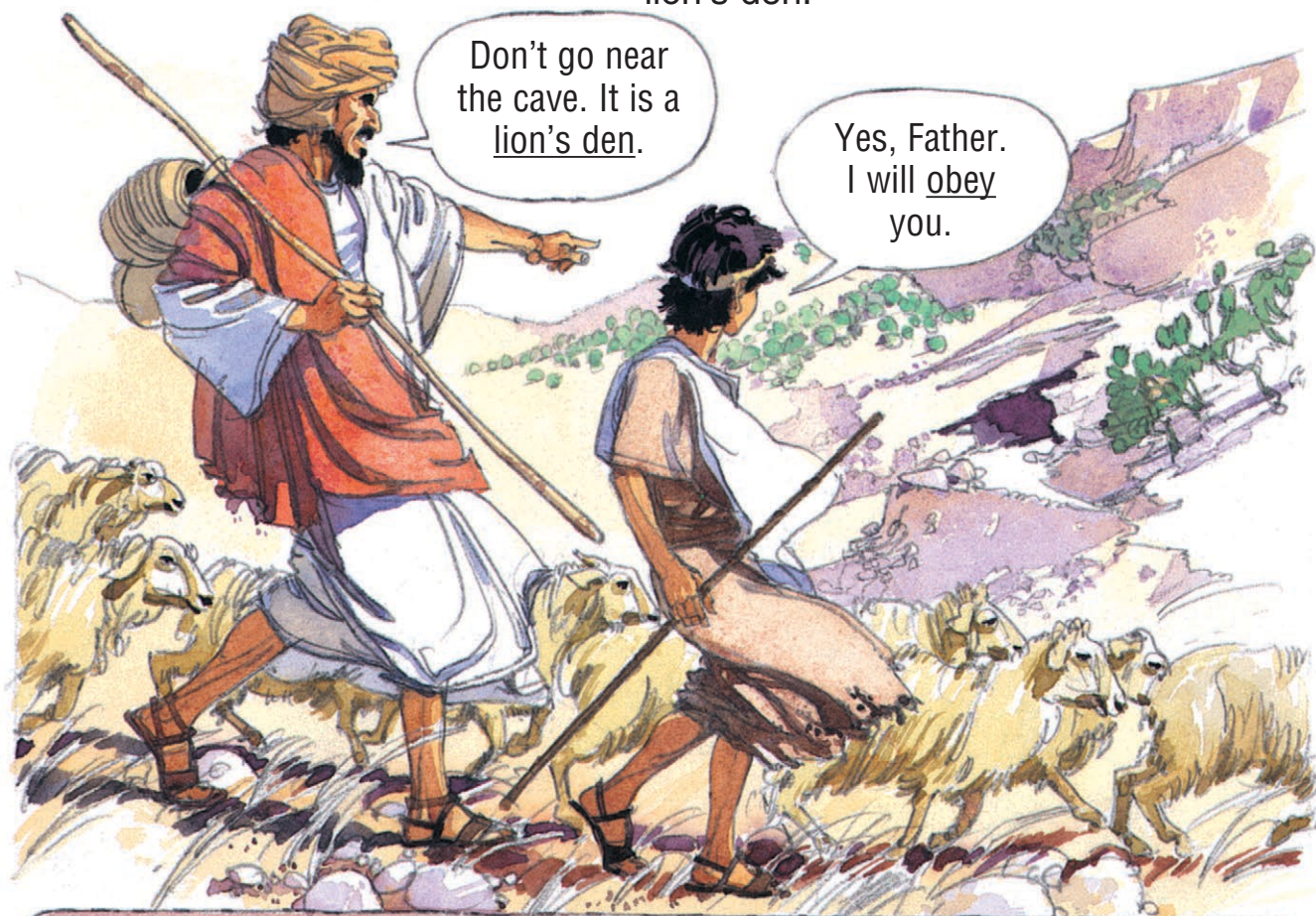
obey

Who's a Hero of God?

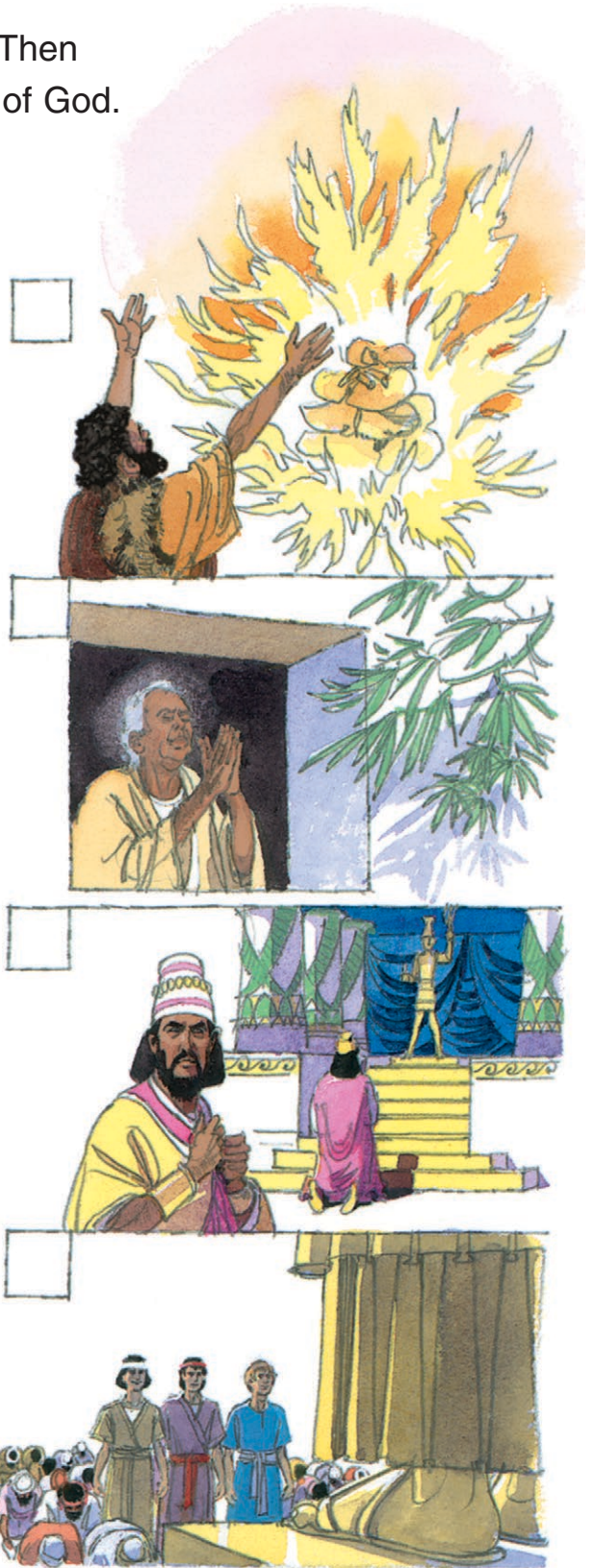
Match the people with the things they did. Then cross out the people who were not heroes of God.
